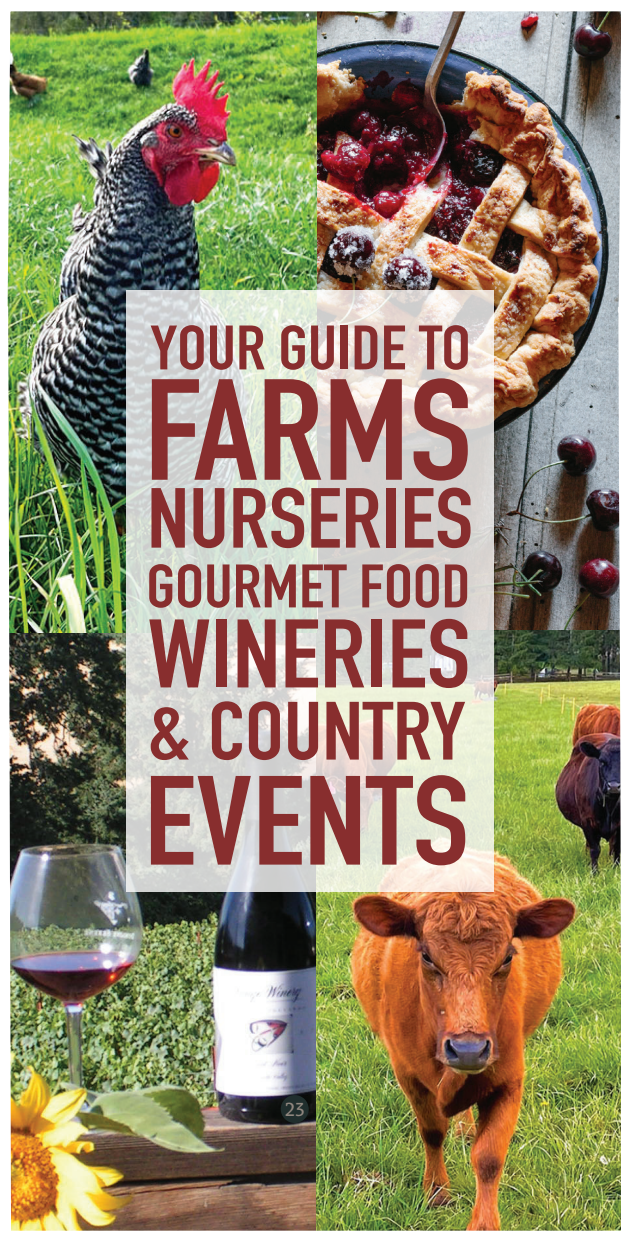

1. Check farm's website and/or call ahead: farms are subject to last-minute issues and could be closed to visitors
2. Read and obey signs
3. Supervise children
4. Stay out of buildings and off equipment

3. Country Cottage Alpacas and Cougars Mark Vineyard

| Michael and I moved to the Willamette Valley over 8 years ago, left the city life of Los Angeles, and started an alpaca farm and bottling our own wine, Cougars Mark. The vineyard was already here and it was a Pinot Grigio, but we have since changed the 2 acres of vineyard to Pinot Noir. Currently, we have 12 alpacas and 1 llama. We also have two Kune Kune pigs and five sheep. As well as chickens, cats and dogs is our guardian dog, Bailey. We recently put a barn on the property with RV hookups and we are working on an outdoor gathering spot for tastings and events. We also have built a small retail shop full of alpaca goodies—lots of pasture and land—26 acres, so plenty of space to walk and explore. We fell in love with this land; we think it has the most beautiful views. So come experience alpacas, take in the views, and taste some wine.
